6 The Green Party of England and Wales, Die Grünen, Groen, Taiwan Tree Party, and
7 Taiwan Green Party, have agreed to the following COMPROMISE text of Resolution 5
8 Advancing LGBT+ Rights.

10 "This Global Greens Congress:

11
12 Supports the establishment of a Global Greens LGBT+ Network comprising
13 representatives across all Federations as an international network for LGBT+ Green
14 activists and organisations affiliated to the Global Greens.

15
16 Endorses the need for LGBT+ Green activists and organisations to:
17 (a) work together through dialogue and discussion crossing national borders to promote
18 the implementation and realisation of the Global Greens Charter as it relates to LGBT+
19 rights in parliaments and in international forums;
20 (b) share information about policy successes and best practice; and
21 (c) support and build capacity of LGBT+ Green parliamentary candidates.

22
23 Acknowledges that the Global Greens LGBT+ Network will work closely and coordinate
24 with the Global Greens Coordination group through the establishment phase and beyond.

25
26 Calls on member organisations to consider establishing and supporting LGBT+ networks
27 within their own organisation.

28
29 Recognising the need to protect and advance the rights of all those who identify as
30 LGBT+, agrees that clause 6.15 of the political action section of the Global Greens
31 Charter be amended as follows:

32 Demand decriminalisation of consensual same-sex sexual relations, legal recognition of
33 transgender people and people of marginalised genders, protection of the right to bodily
34 autonomy including for intersex people, and equal rights for same-sex relationships.

35
36 Upholds the principle that everyone has the right to love and found families. We support
37 local communities in their call for marriage equality or any other form of families or
38 cohabitation they see fit for their context.

39
40 Through its member organisations, will advocate for governments to cease any
41 punishment, violence and cruel treatment towards LGBT+ people and to implement the
42 Yogyakarta principles on the Application of International Human Rights Law in relation
43 to Sexual Orientation and Gender Identity.

44
45 We ask that all governments in the world abolish laws that view LGBTIQ+ sexual
46 orientation and behavior as illegal. LGBTIQ+ communities should not be legally

47 deprived of their rights to property, personal liberty, and life because of their sexual
48 orientation and behavior.

49
50 We oppose any government that bans, hinders, or oppresses LGBTIQ+ information,
51 speech, work, and other initiatives, and commits discrimination.

52
53 We demand that “LGBTIQ+ Mainstreaming” be instituted at every level of government.
54 All government agencies must, when formulating, implementing and evaluating all types
55 of policies and services, take into consideration the situation, needs, and impact on the
56 LGBTIQ+ community. They should especially pay attention to whether resources are
57 adequate and address intersectional discrimination. To maximize effectiveness,
58 LGBTIQ+ Mainstreaming should be planned and coordinated by a designated agency at
59 an appropriately high level.”
